March begins the testing season. All 10th graders will be taking the CAHSEE (California High School Exit Exam) on March 17th and 18th. California requires that students pass the test in English and in Math prior to graduation. If a student does not pass one or both of the sections, he/she will have ample opportunities to take the test(s) again prior to graduation.

Numerous other events will be held during March including: SRJC Placement Testing for current Seniors, the Bob Burke Charity Fundraiser, a Swing Dance benefiting the Band and Orchestra program, Choir Variety Show, College Night for Juniors, SRJC Parent Information Night, Parent Preview Days and numerous sporting events. Please check the calendars located in the back of this publication or check our website for more information.

On Thursday, March 5, we will welcome a visiting California Distinguished School panel. This is the next step in the process towards achieving the California Distinguished School award. At the end of their visit, the committee will submit a report based on their findings to the California Department of Education. Final notification will take place in April.

Parents of our incoming 9th graders and other interested parents will be welcomed on March 23rd and 30th for Parent Preview Day. This new event gives parents whose student will be attending Analy and/or parents interested in having their student attend Analy, the opportunity to come and see the campus and visit classrooms during the school day.

FRESHMEN AWE LOCAL LIONS

Two Analy freshmen awed Local Lions Club audiences with their 10 minute orations on "Water" Will California Be Left High and Dry?" Zeus Smith spoke past the competition at the Gravenstein Lions Club and Brendan Reid-Naughton orated his way to victory at the Roseland Lions Club. Both of these students will represent Analy at the regional competition.

ANALY ORATOR FIRST IN THE STATE VFW CONTEST

After years of coming close (2nd place 3 years in a row!!), Analy sophomore Gordon Allen earned Analy the right to brag that it had the best orator in the Veterans of Foreign Wars speech contest. A total of 1,057 students participated this year in the state of California, with 24 finalists competing in Sacramento for the first place prize of \$3000. After he cashes his check, Gordon will enjoy an all-expense paid trip to Washington DC where he will vie for the top \$30,000 prize and have the opportunity to meet President Barak Obama.

SPEAKERS TOTE HOME TROPHIES FROM SONOMA

On February 21st, Analy speakers toted home trophies from the final league competition of the year. Gustavo Vasquez had a winning record in Lincoln Douglas debate, Mitch Davis took 3rd place in Original Oratory, Lukey Tamminen and Aidan O'Donnel shared an undefeated record in Parliamentary debate and Gordon Allen was undefeated in Lincoln Douglas debate for his 3rd consecutive tournament, giving him the right to "auto-qual" to the state tournament! Only 3 students in the entire league managed this feat and this is only the second time that a student from Analy has achieved this honor—congratulations, Gordon!

POETRY OUTLOUD AT LUNCH!

Thirteen Analy speakers strode to the front of the library at lunch to recite poetry in the school's first Poetry Outloud contest. Sponsored by the National Endowment of the Arts, the Poetry Outloud contest brought poet Phyllis Meshlaum to the oral interpretation class to coach students on tone and delivery. Sophomore, Laura Dalzell wowed the judges with her interpretation skills, and Laura went on to represent Analy at the Sonoma County contest on February 21st where she received honors and finger-snapping applause.

Counselor's Corner

Third quarter progress reports have arrived home by now. We hope things are going well for all students. If you need assistance through the Tutorial Center or using weekly tutorials to help you in classes, be sure to take advantage of these opportunities. The end of the 3rd quarter is Friday, March 20, 2009.

As a reminder, counselors will be going into Social Studies classes during the week of March 9– 13 to begin the registration process for next year's classes. As we begin this process, just know that changes can be made, and there is plenty of time to get questions answered. We will review course selections and review student's progress towards graduation. If you have questions, feel free to call the counseling department.

Also, SRJC summer session limits enrollment of high school students. If your child is interested in attending SRJC during the summer, Concurrent Enrollment Forms **MUST** be returned to your counselor by Thursday, April 2 !!!!!

Seniors:

We will be administering the SRJC Placement Test on Thursday, March 12 from 2:15 – 6:00 in the Analy Library. Be sure to sign up in the Counseling Office. Space is limited to 60 people and we need to plan for students planning to test. This will include both the English and Math placement tests.

Also we will have an SRJC Information Night on Thursday, March 26 from 7 – 8:30 pm in the Analy Library. This is a very helpful evening for students and parents wanting more information on SRJC and steps to prepare for the transition from high school to college.

Finally, to seniors planning to attend 4-year colleges, keep in mind that ALL acceptances are provisional. Be sure to keep focused on your classes and grades. Colleges DO look at the final transcript to ensure you have completed your course of study in a satisfactory way.

The Graduation Participation Policy requires students to be passing ALL required classes and to have acceptable attendance in courses required for graduation. Check with your counselor if you have questions. Students and parents, poor attendance and grades can mean you won't walk in the graduation ceremony. Please be sure to be responsible to avoid any major disappointments. Reminder : FINAL day to complete any ISP or after school make-up work is Wed., May 20, 2009! Get going!!!

Juniors:

The College Information Night is scheduled for Thursday, March 19 from 7:00 – 8:00 pm in the Analy Library. Please mark this on your calendar. Spring SAT test dates are rapidly approaching. Please see the "New and Noteworthy" on the counseling website for test dates and registration deadlines as well as other vital information.

The spring College Fair held at SSU is scheduled for Wednesday, April 29. Colleges from across the nation send representatives to answer questions for students as they embark on the college process. We plan to take all juniors to this event. There is also an evening session from 6-8:00 pm.

Sophomores:

Keep in mind, your grades for college admission are calculated during your 10th and 11th grades. Please do your best to keep your opportunities open. Also, as you know, the Good Driving Discount requires students to earn at least a 3.0 gpa. This is a substantial savings.

Freshman:

As we enter the spring, we hope that you have transitioned well to Analy High School—made new friends, developed relationships with your teachers, attended various sporting events and even joined teams as well as enjoyed theater and music productions...perhaps even joined a club or two! Our doors are open to help you plan for next year and help you in any way. Please sign up to see us. This goes for all students!

“iPods” on Campus

Each year, personal listening devices with names like iPod, iRiver, MP3, cell phones, etc. become smaller and more expensive. In fact, the iPod “Nano,” which retails at almost \$300.00, is so small one could conceivably lose it in a pocket. Unfortunately, the small size of these devices make them easy to lose and equally easy to steal.

Again, we want to emphasize that students should not bring these items to school. Ideally, we would like to see these devices remain safe at home. However, should your student be allowed to bring his or her device to school, please advise him or her of the following:

- Analy is not responsible for lost or stolen items.
- There is very little the school can do by way of recovering a lost or stolen item.
- Items like iPods are very easy to lose and can also be stolen very easily .

Please speak try and discourage your students from bringing these items to school. If they must, please advise them of the above information.
