Welcome to our incoming 9th graders! We're looking forward to getting to know you and working with you throughout high school. Be sure to enjoy your final days at junior high school. It's a great time to share memories and friendships. Lives will move in new and different directions, so value your time together before you begin your high school careers.

Likewise with out seniors—be sure to enjoy these precious last days together with your friends and peers. It all passes so quickly and it is a time to joy, friendship, accomplishment and celebration. For all students, enjoy your summer as you relax, vacation, work or spend time with your friends. It's been a great year and we hope that you've achieved your goals and are looking forward to a great summer.

Seniors:

Be sure to request that your final transcript be sent to your school of choice. All colleges require this; you can submit your request during graduation practice. There will be a sign up sheet outside the registrar's office in June. Remember ALL acceptances are based on completing your coursework that you reported during the initial application period. Your grades must be consistent with previous work and be acceptable for admission standards.

This is a great and special time in your life. Everything is intensified—your friendships, memories, regrets, fears and joys. It's magical! All of you are concerned about the transition from high school to the next step. It is an unknown time filled with much anticipation and anxiety. Be sure to see your counselor to talk through your questions and transitions. It's all normal!

Finally, graduation participation is based on successful completion of ALL make up work whether it's at SRJC, after school classes or Independent Study contracts. Additionally, your satisfactory attendance to required classes MUST be within the limits of our variable attendance – credit policy .Excessive unexcused absences in required classes WILL keep you out of the graduation ceremony. Failure to make up required work WILL keep you out of the graduation ceremony.! These requirements WILL be verified before the graduation ceremony! Be fully aware of your status. The final date for ISP and After School work is Wed., May 20, 2009. We will need verification of successful completion of SRJC classes prior to graduation. See your counselor if you have questions.

Juniors:

You'll be seniors in just a few weeks! It's a great year! You'll be the leaders of our school—setting the tone and standards for a successful and rewarding year. It's both a big responsibility and privilege and we know you'll make us proud!

This is your last summer to make up work at summer school. See you counselor to review
