I want to thank our wonderful staff for the caring support they gave students during the days that followed the death of one of our students. I hope you as parents found the information that we sent out to be helpful during this tragic event. In addition to the letter that was sent home, we did use our website to keep you apprised.

STAR Testing will take place April 17-19 and April 24-26, 2007. Students in grades 9-11 will be taking these tests and we ask that parents support their student and the school by encouraging your student to give their best efforts to these vital tests. Parents who have a student in the 11th grade should also be aware that there is a section of the test called the EAP or Early Assessment Placement. This section, if passed, will exempt a student from taking the college English and Math Placement exams. It will also address college readiness and provide appropriate learning opportunities for the student if needed, during their senior year. This augmented portion of the test includes 15 multiple choice questions in both Math and English plus an essay. This portion of the test is optional but highly recommended. Results of this part of the test combined with the results of the California Standards Test, provide juniors and their parents with early signals regarding their readiness for the rigor of college English and Math courses. We ask parents of juniors to talk with their student about the opportunity and encourage them to take this short, additional portion of the test (even if they are not certain about applying to a UC or CSU campus.)

I want to take this opportunity to the Educational Foundation for a wonderful event on March 10. The Local Color Showcase showcased many of our local and student artists while benefiting Analy High School. The work involved and the efforts made on behalf of the Analy staff and students were very much appreciated.

A reminder to all parents and students. In several issues of our SIP ZIP this year, we have asked parents to remind their student that they "should not bring items of value such as iPods, MP3 players, jewelry or large amounts of cash to school. They should also make sure that they do not leave their backpack unattended, even for a short time. **Analy High School cannot assume responsibility for personal property brought to school.**" This policy is also posted in all of our classrooms.

COUNSELOR'S CORNER

It is amazing that we are already approaching the end of the third quarter with only one busy fourth quarter remaining in this school year! We registered the 9th, 10th, and 11th grade students for the 2006-07 school year in the Social Studies classes during the week of March 5th. During this registration period, we also explained and reviewed each student's graduation status report. In addition, we explained the A-G subject areas required for admission to the University of California and California State University. When considering a course load, please carefully contemplate several issues. Consider the rigor of your classes very carefully. 4-year colleges do expect to see as many core academic classes as possible on a student's schedule. However, it is important for a student to remember sports, band, drama, work and other personal commitments and be realistic about the academic challenges that he or she can successfully undertake. Also, keep in mind that high school is the time to explore and take many exciting elective classes, not only for enrichment, but also as a means of determining a possible career path.

Please take advantage of all the wonderful opportunities Analy offers. Plan on joining or starting a club, playing sports, participating in choir, band, or a drama production or running for an office this spring or next year. As you become more involved and connected to the school, the more successful you will be in all aspects of your life. Besides, it is fun!!!

The counselors would like to remind all students about the Peer Mediation program. Our student mediators have been trained to help students resolve conflicts. It may be an alternative to administrative intervention. The process seems to have very positive results. We are proud of our mediators and the students who elect to participate in an effort to improve their relationships. Our Safe School Ambassadors program also is contributing to a relatively calm and conflict-free semester. Our Ambassadors have attended a workshop that prepared them to intervene if they observe other students mistreating their peers or involved in a conflict. They meet in their family groups and are becoming increasingly aware of the impact that their training and participation is having on our school climate. They also organized, sponsored, and participated in a soccer scrimmage for diverse groups of students.

Again this year, **Santa Rosa Junior College** will be limiting the number of high school students who can enroll in their classes to 5% of each high school class this summer. This limitation does not apply to registration during the fall or spring semesters, with the exception of PE classes, which are restricted. The restriction will definitely limit the number of Analy students who will be eligible for enrollment this summer. Please pick up and return concurrent enrollment forms, required for registration to the JC, to the counseling office by **April 20**. Open enrollment at SRJC is **May 10 and 11th, 7am-11pm** for eligible students. The signature of both the principal and the counselor must be on the form prior to registration. It is unlikely that all high school students will be able to attend the JC this summer so please plan ahead in order for us to approve as many enrollment forms as possible.

Please check out our beautiful counseling web page at www.analy.org, which is maintained by Mr. Heil. Important dates and presentations are noted. You will find valuable information about college, career, and other related counseling issues. It is fabulous!

Information for Seniors- **Please note important dates and information highlighted in bold type.**

Make sure that everything is in place for graduation! Do well in your final semester and leave Analy on a positive note! Postpone major senioritis until after graduation! Please check your credits required for graduation. **Remember the new Graduation Participation Policy:** All classes required for graduation must be passed with full credit. Unexcused absences cannot be cleared after May 29th. Make-up credits must be completed by May 29th. Check with your counselor if you have any questions about graduation status or plans for next year.

Students may check with the Career Center for scholarship information. Most college bound students have been notified of college entrance decisions. The student's response to the colleges is usually required by **May 1st**. Doyle Scholarship applications have been completed in the American Government/Economic classes. Award letters will be arriving later this spring. If a student did not quite qualify based on 7th semester grades, they may reapply after their final semester. An SRJC counselor will be on our campus this spring for registration into the Counseling 370 course. This is a .5 unit class that will introduce students to the JC, and helping them with priority registration for courses in the fall. Assessment tests in English and math required for JC registration will also be offered at Analy later this spring. Look for information to follow in the counseling office.

Information for Juniors

The entire Junior Class will be attending the College Fair at Sonoma State **May 1st**. Now is the time to seriously consider what you want to do after graduation. Contemplate, for instance, what you want to study, where you want to live, the size of the school and community and, of course the cost. Do you want a four-year or a two-year college or university or a school focused on a particular area of study such as art, automobiles, or technology? We will be discussing your options in more depth in the months ahead. Most importantly, do well in school and you will keep your options open!

SAT and ACT test dates are fast approaching. 4-year college bound students, please check the websites, collegeboard.com or act.org, for test dates and registration information. Information is also available in the counseling office. We recommend that juniors take the tests in May or June this spring. Remember the SAT 2 subject based tests if you are considering a University of California campus or another school that requires the test.

Information for Sophmores

The sophomores participated in a weeklong career education unit in their World History classes. They have had the opportunity to explore their interests and skills and connect them to particular career areas. Please keep up the good work, review your 4-Year Learning Plan and continue to make your academics a priority as you are considering choices for your future. Please seek out assistance if you are struggling academically. It is never too late to improve and be successful in your classes.

Information for Freshman

Congratulations on completing ¾'s of your first year of high school! This is an important time for you to evaluate your

goals and seriously plan for the next three years. You have received a 4-year plan that was completed during registration. Please spend some time with your parents and counselor reviewing your four-year academic plan.

CAREER CENTER NEWS

An overview of what is happening in the Career Center...

About 270 sophomores have completed the Career Unit. Only the AP World History class has yet to spend a week considering what future plans may be appropriate for them. Students completed two self-assessments, considered the results and then researched several careers. Most sophomores now also have newly created resumes in their Career Planning Folders.

Soon, juniors will have the opportunity to complete a "college/vocational search" in anticipation of the Sonoma State College Fair, which will take place on May 1st. Students will fill out a questionnaire asking what they are looking for in an educational experience to follow graduation. One or more college information websites and/or software programs will then be used to generate a list of post high school opportunities (colleges, universities, vocational programs) that match a student's needs and desires. Hopefully, this experience will help students focus on what they are looking for and give some direction to their College Fair visit.

As always, students are encouraged to come in to the Career Center and spend time further researching "post-Analy" education opportunities. The search they will complete in history classes can take advantage of just a few of the available resources.

With summer not very far off, a file of opportunities available to students for the summer months is available in the Career Center. Some deadlines for registration have already passed. If your student is looking for something to do, have him/her check the opportunities as soon as possible.

One great opportunity is Youth Business Week. While the official deadline for application has not passed, many spots are already filled. If your student is interested in spending an all expense paid week at Sonoma State learning about him/herself, the world of business and the skills it takes to get along with a group working toward a common goal this is the program. As always, the arrival of warm weather means many students are anxious to line up summer jobs. Unfortunately, we have notice of very few available, local student positions. 

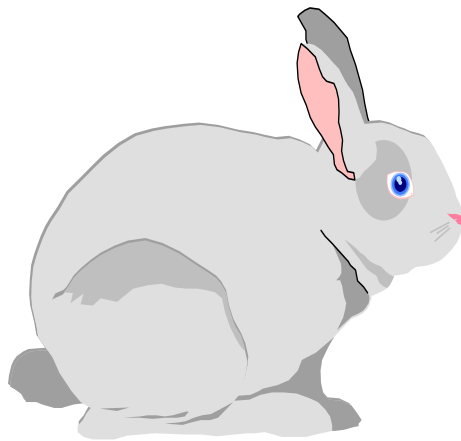
