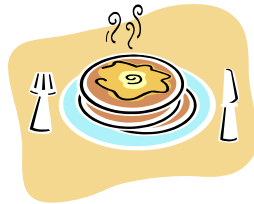

Speaking of Speech **Lynnette Williamson**

Three Analy Debate Teams Qual to State!

Our league qualifies four varsity parliamentary debate teams to state. Fifty-eight teams from 20 Bay Area schools competed for those four slots. Analy won three of them! That's right—three Analy teams will represent our league at State Champs in late April at the University of Santa Clara. “High-Five” to these outstanding debaters seniors who have competed on the team for four years: Autumn Burnes, Chris Catterton, Michael Millerick, Harrison Noah, and Sam Stafford. They secured their bids to state by debating 8 rounds on Saturday March 8th at Irvington HS in Fremont. To win their final round, they ran cases against Agricultural Subsidies, defeating teams from James Logan HS, Bishop O' Dowd and The Bentley School.

Each of their rounds began with the announcement of a resolution on foreign or domestic policy, followed by 20 minutes to prepare a case and 45 minutes to debate it. These students are well-read, articulate, and both witty and withering in their cross-examination skills. Last year the debate team of Chris Catterton and Sam Stafford took third in the state, and Analy HS took home the second place sweepstakes trophy. This year, anything is possible, but one thing is for sure—we will have a blast doing it!

Speaking of State

Zoe Leverant, our extemporaneous team captain, has done it again—securing one of our leagues six slots in National Extemporaneous, Zoe will represent Analy at the state tournament. Zoe is one of those amazing speakers who is able (unlike her coach) to pronounce the names of the presidents of Iran and Russia in the same sentence and quote them respectively from an *Economist* article. Speaking their way into alternate slots to state were: Michael Millerick with an oratorical interpretation of Stephen Colbert's press corps speech; and Ryan Taylor-Davis in national extemporaneous speaking.

Counselor's Corner

All Students: We are in the throws of course requests for next year. Please see your counselor if you have questions at all as you make decisions for next year. Significant to this is the topic of summer courses at SRJC. Remember that we are limited in the number of students who may attend SRJC during the summer. If you are planning to attend SRJC, be SURE to have your Concurrent Enrollment Form into your counselor or the counseling office no later than Thursday, April 17. Forms are in the counseling office should you need them.

Summer school applications are not yet available. I expect them to be here sometime during April or May. Keep your eyes and ears open as we will announce when they are available.

Seniors:

After much effort and anxiety, the wait is over. We know there are many congratulations to you as well as many heartfelt disappointments for you. Please know that your counselor is here to help in any way possible and to join you in your good news. Also, remember that all acceptances are provisional. Colleges expect you to maintain a strong senior year and that classes you reported in the fall must be completed successfully in the spring. Should you change your schedule, be sure to let your campus know so that no one is surprised when they receive the final transcript. Keep in mind, "things happen for a reason and things always turn out for the best", so if you've been disappointed by your "favorite" campus, please come see your counselor to look at possible alternatives.

Equally important is the Graduation Participation Policy! Seniors must stay "on track" for graduation—including both attendance and successfully passing classes. Excessive unexcused absences in any class required to a diploma will keep a student out of the Graduation Ceremony. It is YOUR responsibility to oversee these areas as they apply to you. Juniors:

keep in mind, students planning to attend the University of California system are encouraged to take their SAT Reasoning test in May 2008 and 2 Subject test from the SAT II in June 2008. Students planning to attend the California State University system or most other private and out-of-state schools are encourage to take their SAT Reasoning test either in May or June 2008. The ACT test is also an option for the SAT. If your are applying to the UC system and choose the ACT, be sure to include the Writing portion as part of your standardized tese.

Sophomores:

If you are currently taking either AP World History or Chemistry (H), we recommend that you register for the June SAT II Subject test in that area. You've worked hard all year long and the AP / H classes best prepare you for the subject test. We want you to maximize the benefit of your diligence in these areas. See your counselor if you have questions as to registration or deciding about these Subject Tests.

Freshman:

Congratulations to you as you finish your first year in high school. Please be sure to use your tutorials, study groups, weekly progress reports or talking with your teachers to improve and succeed in your classes. We all want you to be confident and prepared for your sophomore year and beyond.

“iPods”, Cell Phones & Electronic Devices on Campus

- Items like iPods are very easy to lose and can also be stolen very easily .

Please speak try and discourage your students from bringing these items to school. If they must, please advise them of the above information.

Math Department

Tutoring

Free math tutoring can be arranged through the Tutorial Center. Have your student stop by the library and visit the Tutorial Center to find out how they can get help.

The math department has collected a list of students who will tutor for pay for nearly all math subjects. Have your student talk to his or her math teacher if you want to hire a student tutor. Santa Rosa JC has a list of tutors available for hire at <http://online.santarosa.edu/presentation/page/?23318>.

Homework

The Analy math department has a common homework policy: A student needs to earn 66% or higher on homework or the highest overall grade they can earn in a math class is a D. Homework provides practice, and practice is a big part of strengthening math skills. In addition, we often cover material in homework that we don't end up putting on a test or quiz. This policy is designed to motivate students to get into the habit of doing their homework and ultimately to do better on tests, quizzes, and their entire course. In addition, we often assign problems for homework that are harder, more difficult, or more interesting than what ultimately shows up on tests and quizzes. Not doing the homework thus means missing out on a significant part of what we are covering in the class. If you have questions about the policy, contact your student's math teacher.

Calling for unused equipment

- Calculators: If you have an unused scientific or graphing calculator laying around your house (perhaps in a room formerly inhabited by a current college student who used to attend Analy) we could put it to good use in the math department. Just drop any calculator that you no longer need by room 103 or have your current student give it to their math teacher. Thanks!
- Palm Pilots: A new grading application we have site licensed here at Analy allows teachers to walk around a class and enter scores into a Palm-based grading program that syncs with their regular desktop grading program, greatly streamlining homework processing. If you have an old Palm that is laying around gathering dust that you'd be willing to donate to get someone else up and running, please contact Walt Hays at 824.2362 or whays@analy.org. The requirements are as follows: Palm OS 4.x or 5.x, 256+ colors, touch screen and stylus. The software, if you would like to read more about it is described at http://www.easygrade.com/feature_handhelds.html.
- Old laptops: If you have an unused or outdated laptop computer that you are willing to donate, please contact Casey Shea at cshea@analy.org or 824.2300 x 2460. We are investigating their use as Linux thin clients in a math class context. Even laptops with broken or missing hard drives are welcome. PROJECT SUCCESS

Please join us in welcoming Michael McCracken who has been selected to serve as the Project SUCCESS Counselor at Analy High School. The Project SUCCESS program is funded by a federal grant written by Sonoma County Office of Education (SCOE) in collaboration with the West Sonoma County Union High School District and West County Community Services(WCCS). The program will provide alcohol and drug education and prevention services to the student body at Analy High.

Mr. McCracken holds a Masters Degree in Counseling Psychology and is a Certified Alcohol and Drug Counselor. He has held management positions at both the Drug Abuse Alternatives Center and the Sonoma County Alcohol and Drug Program at Orenda Center. He is employed and supervised by West County Community Services.

Project SUCCESS Program components include a prevention education series, individual and group counseling using a brief counseling model, screening and referral services, on-campus parent programs, and school-wide awareness and outreach activities. Project SUCCESS goals include 1) providing increased alcohol and drug awareness, 2) the introduction of effective coping skills,3) the promotion of healthy lifestyles and life choices among students on campus and 4) a net reduction in alcohol and other drug use among students.

The Prevention Education Curriculum is delivered in groups of ten students in a series of seven classes held on Mondays; the classes are rotated each week to insure that every student only misses a particular class once during the entire seven-week class rotation.

Project SUCCESS is a voluntary program. We believe with Michael McCracken's assistance, Project SUCCESS will offer another opportunity to positively engage your student in a valuable learning process, while providing a venue to raise and answer questions about patterns of alcohol and drug use that represent issues of personal and public safety to every concerned parent.

What's new in Analy's Architecture / Engineering Lab & Model Shop

SUMMER TRANSFORMATION: See what's happening in Analy's best kept secret, the newly created Engineering Model Shop. This past summer saw a transformation in Analy's drafting program, gone are the tables once used for manual drafting and in their place a complete machine/model shop has materialized. Students enrolled in Analy's CADD (computer aided drafting and design) classes now have the opportunity to not only create designs of projects and products, they can manufacture models and in many cases the actual components of their designs. It is one thing to create a design on paper, another to actually manufacture it and hold it in your hands. The machinery and equipment now in the lab make Analy's Cadd Drafting program unique in Sonoma county. Nowhere else is manufacturing capability and engineering drawing combined in one facility. Some of the tools and machinery now in place include a CNC (computer numerically controlled) router and wood lathe and a small bench top mill, two engine lathes, a mill/drill, injection molding and vacuum forming equipment, sheet metal forming tools, plasma torch, mig welder, band saw, drill press, and a pedestal grinder and polisher. We also have access to the wood shop and its resources. If a student can design it we can probably produce it.

NEW WEBPAGE COMING SOON: I am currently working on a web page to highlight Analy's Cadd Drafting program. I hope to have it up and available for viewing by April 4th, in time for incoming freshman to see the exciting opportunities Analy's CADD drafting classes have to offer. SPECIAL THANKS TO COMPUMOTOR: I want to take this opportunity to thank Compumotor in Rohnert Park and engineers Dave, Scott, and Ravi. Due to their efforts the CNC lathe in our model shop is soon to be up and running. After speaking with Dave, Compumotor donated a new control system and Scott and Ravi helped in getting everything wired together and provided the software to get our lathe back online.
