## **SHORT TERM INDEPENDENT STUDY AND YOUR STUDENT**

The State of California has begun a more active and detailed auditing of attendance, including the use of Independent Study. In order to meet the new standards, the West Sonoma County Union High School District has spent the last year updating the administrative regulations that govern the use of Independent. In particular, this means that there are new guidelines for the use of Short Term Study by students and families.

Short Term Independent Study (STIS) is used for absences of 5 to 20 school days. **In order for a student to set up a STIS requires at least 5 school days notice to the school site Independent Study Coordinators: Vice Principal Brenda Hoff at 824-2309 (A-J) or Vice Principal Mike Miller at 824-2320 (K-Z). A contract must be created between the student/parents with each individual class teacher and the school, as per the revised District and State guidelines. This must be completely arranged before the absence begins or credit can be lost and grades affected.**

## COUNSELORS CORNER

All Students: As we near completion of the first quarter for the year, Friday, October 19, 2007, it is time to continue to reevaluate goals for the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of the year. Remember, the first semester ends Friday, December 21, 2007. There won't be time to make up work/ assignments over the Christmas holidays, so be sure to "stay on top of your work" as the semester progresses. Use a daily and consistent routine to completing homework. It's the follow through in these good habits that will help you to have the success in school, in your life and in your goals.

Also, regarding attendance—remember we use a "variable credit policy" which means that if you have excessive *unexcused* absences you may be losing credits in classes. See your counselor if you have questions.

4% -- 10 are attending Specialty Schools—Art Colleges, Beauty Schools, Technical Schools, other music and performing art programs and Fashion Institute of Design and Merchandising  
1 student is attending an international program  
3 students said they were working, and  
3 students said they were travelling

### **Seniors:**

We're in the thick of college admissions. The Career Center is planning a tutorial to complete online applications to the CSU's on Thursday, October 18 during 6<sup>th</sup> period. Be sure to sign up. If you have not yet started your CSU application, this is an excellent opportunity to address it. If you are applying to private colleges, be sure to give the necessary forms to your counselor so that letters may be written, forms completed and deadlines met in a reasonable timeframe. There will be a UC tutorial November 15 during 6<sup>th</sup> period which is specific to their application. As a guideline, we recommend applications to colleges be completed by Thanksgiving!

For those doing make up work...congratulations to you! Keep it up! For those of you not yet started...get yourselves going!!!

**Juniors and Sophomores**

The PSAT is Saturday, October 20. Sign up with Nancy Siebert in the registrar's office. The cost is \$20 and you must register prior to the test day. The PSAT is an excellent preparation for the SAT. It gives excellent feedback on your answers; provides a great college/career search program and gives you an excellent measurement in standardized testing compared to other college bound students across the nation. It's well worth the Saturday effort!

Besides academics, be sure to focus on hobbies and interests. Attend high school events; watch your peers as they perform in drama productions, sports, concerts. You'll find the rewards in these social events to be relaxing, engaging and enriching. Life is always a balance between responsibilities and relaxation. ## NEWS FROM ANALY DRAMA

Veni, Vidi, Vici...yeah,...it's all Greek to me, too! This fall, Analy Theatre Arts Department proudly presents *Lysistrata*, a modern adaptation of Aristophanes' comedy.

Aristophanes, a Greek playwright of 5<sup>th</sup> century BCE, wrote a series of anti-war plays and *Lysistrata* was his third and last one. Imagine, it is now the twenty-first year of the Peloponnesian Wars with little prospect of peace. A desperate state of things demands a desperate remedy, and the Poet proceeds to suggest a slightly burlesque solution to the difficulty.

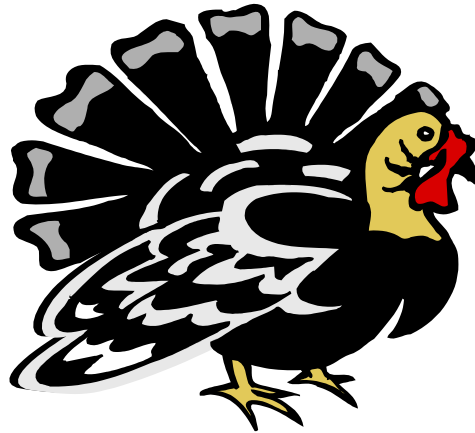
The women of Athens, led by Lysistrata and supported by female delegates from the other states of Hellas (Greece) are tired of losing their sons and husbands on the battle fields and are determined to take matters into their own hands and force the men to stop the War. They meet in solemn conclave, and Lysistrata expounds her scheme, the rigorous application to husbands and lovers of a self-denying ordinance--"we must refrain from men altogether." Every wife and woman is to abstain from men's affections, till the men have come to terms of peace. By these means Lysistrata assures the women that they will very soon gain their end. "If we sit indoors prettily dressed in our best silks and alluring fashions, all nicely 'decked-out', they will be able to deny us nothing." Such is the burden of her advice.

After no little rebuttal, this plan of campaign is adopted, and the assembled women take a solemn oath to observe the compact faithfully. In the meantime, as a precautionary measure, the Chorus of older women of Athens seize the Acropolis, where the State treasure is kept. The Chorus of old men of the city assault the doors, but are repulsed by "the terrible regiment" of women. Much excellent fooling around between the two hostile bands ensues in the fight for possession of the citadel. In the meantime, Lysistrata wards off a mutiny that has been ensuing from a small faction of frustrated women by impressing upon them the importance of their conviction. Peace is concluded, and the play ends with the hilarious festivities of the Athenian and Spartan celebration of the event.

Note: Our play is rated PG-13 and suggested for the fun-at-heart audience. The play opens on Nov. 9, plays Nov. 10, 15, 16, 17 @ 7:30 pm and Nov. 11, a matinee @ 2:00 pm, which is our Veterans Day Benefit show offering a FREE SHOW to Veterans.
