Fall is in the air and we're off to an exciting 2007-2008 school year. Classes seem to be settled and we're fast approaching our first quarter progress reports. These are important times for all students at different grade levels.

All Students: High school is a time of personal and educational development. You are responsible for your own success and goals. Learning to problem solve situations is a skill built throughout life. Opportunities avail themselves, but it is up to you to take advantage of them. Tutorial is one of those opportunities. All students benefit from establishing strong study habits; attending tutorial gives you a chance to ask questions, formulate productive study habits and become engaged in your school program. Talk to your teachers if you have questions; utilize the tutorial center in the library for assistance; see your counselor as your contact person for a myriad of issues and assistance.

Seniors: this is the "college application" time. Pay attention to the important information outside room 102 in the main hallway. MySpace.Com: Parents Beware

We ran this article in a previous SIP ZIP, however, due to the recent events in the news we felt it was important to run it again.

We live in an age of technological advances far beyond what our parents and grandparents could imagine. While many of these developments are useful, there are dangers as well. As a school, our latest concern has been profiling websites. An example of a profiling website that is used by many students is MySpace.com. A profiling website is much like a public diary. Many of them are free and allow the designer to display personal information, likes, dislikes, pictures, comments to friends, etc. It becomes a personal page that represents the designer. During adolescence the desire to formulate identity is one of their intrinsic goals, so this type of website is very appealing. The downfall to profiling websites is the messages that some of our students are sending. Messages of violence, harassment, sexual implications, vulgarity, and illegal substances are strewn throughout our students' pages. Already this year we have had several cases where comments on MySpace.com have created bullying and harassment situations that transfer to our school and influence the educational atmosphere.

The first step is communication with your student. We are alerting parents to be cautious about your student's freedom on the computer and urging parents to monitor student's messages on profiling websites.

Analy High School has chosen to block this site due to its content.

Career Center News

Welcome back Analy students! The beginning of the school year is the perfect opportunity to remind new and returning students just what the Career Center is all about. A quick overview of activities now taking place will follow and throughout the year details of additional Career Center programs will be included here.

In the broadest of terms, the Career Center provides resources and information in many areas which students will face in their lives during and “after Analy.” Continuing education, financial aid, resources for finding employment, becoming familiar with basic job skills, starting a part time job or completing the necessary documents required for that job are some of the areas upon which the Career Center focuses.

To help with pursuing post-secondary education, the Career Center organizes visits from college, university and technical school representatives. Recruiters schedule visits to the campus and students, especially juniors and seniors are encouraged to sign up for and attend informational presentations in the Library. A few of those already scheduled this year are St Mary’s, University of San Diego, Colorado State University and Evergreen College.

Information on college and university Open Houses, Preview Days and off campus recruiter visits is available in the Career Center and posted on the Counseling & Career Center bulletin board in the main hallway. Students are encouraged to check for new information often and to read the Analy Bulletin for updates.

A few part-time job openings are currently posted in the Career Center. Community businesses may call to post information on their employment needs. Help with resume writing, completion of job applications and interviewing skills is available for students as well.

On **October 18th and November 15th** a tutorial on filling out the application will be available to students during sixth period. Your student is encouraged to come in and get assistance with the application at that time or schedule an additional time to do that with me.

As much as we would like to believe that everyone is trustworthy and respects the property of others, the reality is that school and personal property gets stolen. While the school cannot assume responsibility for personal property brought to school, we are taking steps to reduce the opportunity for theft. Here are a few tips to help students avoid becoming a victim:

- 1. Do not bring items of value to school, such as iPods, MP3 players or jewelry.**
- 2. Do not bring large sums of money to school, and do not advertise how much money you do have to other students.**
- 3. The biggest theft problem has been in the PE locker room. Most students use backpacks, which are too big to store in a locker and are, therefore, left out in the locker room. Wallets and other important items should be removed from the backpack and locked in the locker.**
- 4. Do not share lockers or lock combinations.**
- 5. Do not leave backpacks unattended for even a short time.
Do not leave valuables visible in a vehicle**

If you believe that you are a victim of theft, please notify the Vice Principal's office as soon as possible. We rely on timely and specific information to help recover stolen property and identify those involved. The student or parent may file a police report regarding stolen personal property, but the school will only file reports on stolen school property.
